1260	Robert Balliol manumits (releases from slavery) one of his tenants in Harwell.

Unknown	Robert dies leaving a son and heir Walter.		
1300	Walter is holding a tenement (property) in Harwell of the honour of St Valery by knight's service.		Edward I 1272-1307

1318	Walter has died and his wife Emma is holding a dower (property for a widow's life). His heir is Thomas Balliol who transfers all his rights to William Bayllol of Harwell.	Edward II 1307-27

Unknown	A tenement called Bayllols with other lands in Harwell (highly likely the manor and lordship) are held by Alice, wife of John Stokes.	Henry V 1413-22

1478/9	Alice has survived her husband and leaves Bayllols to Robert Holcote in Buckland who is the son of her cousin Richard (son of Alice, sister of John). This is the last reference to the manor and lordship of Bayllols.
