1534	<b>The Act of Supremacy – Church of England</b>	Henry VIII 1509-47
1536	The Crown called for the closure of the Abbey but the monks petitioned for its continuation and paid a fee to the Crown to have a reprieve.	
1538	The monastery is finally surrendered into Crown hands along with the lordship and manor of Maryland. All the assets of the Abbey come into the possession of Thomas, Lord Wriothesley but Maryland is not specifically mentioned and not heard of again.
