1412	John Washington makes a grant of a tenement in Dalton to Sir John Croft.	
1423	John de Washington II dies leaving the Manor to his son Robert Washington III.	Henry V 1413-22 Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1437	Robert creates a feoffment of his lands in Warton, Silverdale, Hutton, Dalton, Over Kellet, Heysham and Preston in Kendall.	
1455-1487	<b>War of the Roses</b>	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83
1483	Robert dies holding Tewitfield of the King by knight's service and 5d. for castle ward; also fifteen burgages in Warton of the Lords of the vill by a rent of 7s. and lands in Silverdale. His son John Washington inherits at thirty years of age.	Edward V 1483 Richard III 1483-5
1499	John Washington dies and leaves a son and heir Robert, aged twenty four.	Henry VII 1485-1509
1517	Robert dies holding the same estates as his father of the King as of his duchy by the fourth part of a knight's fee, leaving his son another Robert.	Henry VIII 1509-47
1527	Robert dies leaving his son and heir Thomas aged twenty five. However Anne Washington appears to be holding Tewitfield and other estates in her own right.	
1534	<b>The Act of Supremacy – Church of England</b>	
1539	Anne's son Richard, aged twenty one succeeds her and is holding her estates.	
Soon after 1539	Tewitfield passes to the Middletons of Leighton. It is no longer referred to as a Manor.	Edward VI 1547-53 Mary I 1553-58 Elizabeth I 1558-1603
