1269	Grimbald dies leaving three daughters as co-heirs. Their guardianship is given to Adam de Holland of Euxton.	
Unknown	The eldest daughter Aline marries Adam's son Robert and her third part of the Manor descends to Molyneux of Sefton with the Manor of Euxton.	Edward I 1272-1307 Edward II 1307-27
Unknown	Another daughter Juliana is carried off and marries Roger de Slene (or Slyne).	
Unknown	The third daughter Ladarena marries William de Catherton.

Mid 14 th Century	Juliana's third passes to the Pleasington family of Healaugh in Swaledale.
