1086	Alwin was recorded as the Domesday Lord who was one of William the Conqueror's bailiffs.

1284	According to the "Testa de Nevill" (a 13 <sup>th</sup> Century version of the Domesday Book) Richard, son of William held one fifth of a knight's fee of William Cantilupe. His daughter Milicent (married to Eudo la Zouche of Harringworth) was holding two hides of land in chief (with no overlord).		Edward I 1272-1307
1302	Millicent's son, William de la Zouche holds a lordship in Edworth.		Edward II 1307-27

1542	John's son Richard conveys Edworth to Reginald Conygrave and his wife Joan.

Unknown	Thomas' daughter marries John Luke and takes Edworth with her.	
Unknown	Edworth is now owned by Nicholas Luke but it is not known what relation he was to John Luke.	
1614	Nicholas' son Oliver inherits Edworth from his father. It is no longer a separate Lordship and Manor of Edworth it being combined with Henlow and Hinxworth. This is also the last reference made of Edworth.	James I 1603-25
