| 1511 | William dies, leaving no son and heir so Thorp passes to his daughter Mary, who is married to Sir William Parre who had been nominated as Sheriff of Northamptonshire last year. Sir William was popular at court being chosen to joust against King Henry on many occasions. | Henry VIII 1509-47 |
| 1519 | Sir William settles Thorp on Sir Ralph Lane, who marries Sir William's daughter Maud a cousin of Catherine Parr, Henry VIII's last Queen. | |
| 1534 | The Act of Supremacy – Church of England | |

| 1580 | Thomas transfers Thorp to Thomas Throckmorton and his wife Muriel (daughter of Sir Robert Throckmorton), probably in trust for Thomas Tresham (grandson of Sir Thomas Tresham and Mary Parre). This is the last record of the lordship and manor of Thorp. | |
