1288	The estate is referred to as "Essebolon" to be become Ash Boulogne, esse meaning ash.		Edward I 1272-1307
1306	Pauline grants Ash Boulogne to her son Peter de Boulogne.		
Unknown	Ash Boulogne passes to Peter's daughter Joan.		Edward II 1307-27

Before 1388	Joan conveys Ash Boulogne to Hugh Paveley.	Edward III 1327-77 Richard II 1377-1399 Henry IV 1399-1413 Henry V 1413-22
1421	Richard Paveley recovers a dower (a widow's share in her late husband's property) in Ash Boulogne.	
1430	Richard sells Ash Boulogne to Hugh Kene, his wife Agnes and their son William.	Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1455-1487	War of the Roses	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83
1467	William being the survivor of the three dies leaving Ash Boulogne to his son Anthony Kene.	
Unknown	William Hody of Pilsdon, Dorset acquires Ash Boulogne.	Edward V 1483 Richard III 1483-5 Henry VII 1485-1509
1524	William conveys Ash Boulogne to his son, Richard.	Henry VIII 1509-47
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England	
1536	Richard dies leaving Ash Boulogne to his son and heir, William.	
1546	The only manor court is held.	
Unknown	William dies leaving Ash Boulogne to his son and heir Henry.	Edward VI 1547-53 Mary I 1553-58 Elizabeth I 1558-1603
Unknown	Henry dies with no children and Ash Boulogne passes to his brother Richard.	
Prior to 1621	Richard dies leaving Ash Boulogne to his wife, Grace, and their two daughters.	James I 1603-25
1621	Grace and her daughters sell Ash Boulogne to her cousin John Hody.	
1622	John enfranchises the lordship thus freeing the tenants from manorial control.
