1245	Jordan has died with no son and left Stocking to his daughter Mabel who of her right her husband John Passelewe is holding Stocking. That said the couple acknowledged the right of Ralph Dayrell to a carucate of land in Stocking and Lathbury. The reversion (whom it transfers to after their interest expires) to go to Geoffrey de Easton Neston and his wife Eustacia in lieu of her marriage dower.		

# Lordship of Stocking

Date	History of Lordship	Monarchs
1247	Ralph has allowed the Passelewes to retain Stocking for their lives. Ralph secures a quitclaim (relinquish of a claim) due to waste on the land by Geoffrey and Eustacia for an annuity of 40 shillings during Eustacia's live.	
Prior to 1254	Ralph dies leaving Stocking to two heiresses Sybil and Alice and their respective husbands William de Merefeld and Peter de Grendon.	
Unknown	The two couples quitclaim (relinquish their rights) in Stocking to Robert Usburn who was holding a lease from Robert Tothall and Mabel de Stocking nee Passelewe.	
1257	Usburn obtains a licence to impark (categorise) his wood in Stocking within Salcey Forest.	
Unknown	Usburn marries Margery (daughter of John de Stocking nee Passelewe).	
1262-1275	Margery is Lady of Stocking in the right of her son Edmund de Usburn or Stocking	
1264-1267	<b>Second Barons War</b>	
1279-1286	Edmund has taken control of Stocking and is now Lord.	Edward I 1272-1307
Prior to 1309	Edmund dies leaving Stocking to John de Usburn.	Edward II 1307-27
1309	John settles Stocking on himself, his wife Alice and their heirs.	
1355	John de Stocking is holding Stocking however it is not clear what relation he is to John de Usburn or if it is him. The Lordship starts to disintegrate with sub-tenancies being absorbed into the Overlordship of Lathbury. The Manor and Lordship of Stocking is not recorded again.	Edward III 1327-77
