Unknown	Woburn Abbey has passed the lordship to the Abbess of Barking and John Grove formerly of Greenhithe, Kent a subordinate lord of Whaddon called South Whaddon.	
1503	John quitclaims (conveys) South Whaddon to Thomas Woodmancy and his heirs.	
1505	Thomas dies leaving South Whaddon to his eldest son, also called Thomas. This is the last record of the Lordship of Whaddon.
