1212	William is one of the “trusted knights” of King Johns Great Inquest of Service. William holds the lordship of Edgeworth and grants 2 oxgangs or a forth part of Edgeworth manor to Robert de Entwistle upon his marriage to William’s daughter and creates the manor and lordship of Entwistle.

Unknown	Robert dies and leaves a son and heir Richard.

Prior to 1276	Richard dies leaving a son and heir Ellis.		Edward I 1272-1307

1292 – 1300	Entwistle passes to Henry and Maud de Entwistle.		

Lordship of Entwistle

Date	History of Lordship	Monarchs
Prior to 1329	John Entwistle is lord of Entwistle subject to the lordship of the Prior of the Hospitallers.	Edward II 1307-27
After 1346	John dies and is succeeded by Ellis Entwistle.	Edward III 1327-77
Prior to 1394	Ellis dies and leaves a son and heir of the same name.	Richard II 1377-1399
1410 – 1420	Entwistle passes to John Entwistle.	Henry IV 1399-1413 Henry V 1413-22
1436	John dies and Entwistle passes to Anian Entwistle.	Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1442	Anian Entwistle dies leaving a son and heir Ellis who is 23 years old. Entwistle is held for a service of 1/16 of a knight's fee being 1s 3d a year.	
1444	It appears John's wife Margaret may have had a life interest in Entwistle as she sues Anian's widow Elizabeth for a dower (compensation to a widow from her late husband's estate).	
Unknown	Entwistle passes to Sir Bertine Entwistle Viscount & Baron of Bricqbec, Normandy who is Bailiff of Constantin. He was knighted by Henry V on the battlefield at Agincourt in 1415. He owes the king 40 days per annum fighting however he appears to love fighting and fought much longer in the Hundred Years War against France.	
1455	Sir Bertine fights for Henry VI at the Battle of St Albans which marks the start of the War of the Roses. Sir Bertine is wounded in the shoulder and 6 days later dies of the injury.	
1455-1487	War of the Roses	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83
1473	Entwistle passes to Ellis Entwistle.	Edward V 1483
Unknown	Entwistle passes to Edmund Entwistle.	Richard III 1483-5 Henry VII 1485-1509
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England	Henry VIII 1509-47
1544	Edmund dies leaving a son and heir George aged 22. Entwistle is held of the king for a rent of 12d which is in lieu of the Hospitallers' rent.	
1546	George makes various settlements from Entwistle

1551	George passes Entwistle to Thurstan Tyldesley, MP for Lancashire, his youngest son, and his heirs. Thurstan is Receiver-General of the Isle of Man.	Edward VI 1547-53
1554	Thurstan dies leaving 2 sons Thomas, the eldest and Edward. Edward inherits Entwistle.	Mary I 1553-58
1586	Edward makes a grant of Entwistle to ensure the hereditary line. He first grants it to himself for life, then Elizabeth the widow of his brother Thomas for life, then Edward the infant son of Thomas. The rent payable is 10d.	Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1621	Edward dies.	James I 1603-25
Unknown	Entwistle passes to Thomas Tyldesley, son of Edward and grandson of Thurstan.	Charles I 1625-49
1641	Thomas enters Gray's Inn to follow a career in the law. He is extremely wealthy with an annual income from his estates totalling £2,050.	
1642-1651	English Civil War	
1642	Thomas is held responsible for the first bloodshed of the Civil War with the shooting of a linen weaver named Richard Perceval at Manchester. Legal proceedings are started against Thomas, but Parliament intercedes and stops the action. Thomas is a lieutenant colonel at the Battle of Edgehill after raising regiments of horse, foot and dragoons.	
1643	For his contribution at the Battle of Burton Bridge Charles I bestows a knighthood on Thomas.	
1645	Sir Thomas is made Governor of Lichfield.	
1651	Sir Thomas, serving as a Major General, is slain at the Battle of Wigan Lane along with half the royal army. The guardians of Sir Thomas' son and heir Edward claim Sir Thomas' considerable estates however they are sequestered by Parliament.	
1657 - 1670	Edward recovers his family estates and sells off Entwistle to a large number of persons and the lordship and manor of Entwistle vanishes from records.	Charles II 1660-85
