1315	John dies and Mary marries Almaric de St Amand.	
1333	Mary dies and Chalton is inherited by her grandson Nicholas (son of Paulinus Pever), who is 14 ½ years old.	Edward III 1327-77
1346	Nicholas has reached the age of majority and takes possession of Chalton.	
1362	Nicholas dies and Chalton is not listed in his lands or recorded again.
