1540	With the dissolution of the Knights Hospitallers in England Millbrook comes under Crown control along with its other Millbrook lands. King Henry immediately grants Millbrook to Sir Richard Longe along with most of the other Knights Hospitallers lands. Sir Richard is one of the senior members of the Privy Chamber (a private apartment in the royal palace).	
1541	Sir Richard includes Millbrook in his marriage settlement on Margaret Kitson. He participates in the trial of Catherine Howard. He is appointed Governor of Guernsey, Alderney and Sark.	
Unknown	John Clark and others are accused of entering into Millbrook and depasturing it.	
1542	Sir Richard is appointed Captain of Kingston upon Hull with power to raise forces if required.	
1544	Sir Richard and Margaret have a son Henry to whom King Henry becomes Godfather.	
1546	Sir Richard dies leaving a son and heir Henry aged 2.	
1561	Margaret dies leaving Millbrook to her son Henry.	Edward VI 1547-53 Mary I 1553-58 Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1569/70	Henry serves as High Sheriff of Cambridgeshire and Huntingdonshire.	
1571	Henry serves as a Member of Parliament for Cambridgeshire.
