1305	Sir Henry dies leaving Aston Bruley to his son Henry.

Unknown	Henry dies and Aston Bruley passes to his older brother William.	Edward II 1307-27
1359	William dies leaving a son and heir Henry.	Edward III 1327-77
1360	Henry dies leaving a daughter and heir Agnes.	
Before 1380	Agnes marries a cousin William Bruley.	Richard II 1377-1399
1395	William serves as a Member of Parliament as Knight of the Shire for Oxfordshire.	
1413/4	William and Agnes convey a toft (homestead) and 2 virgates of land (60 acres) to John Lynton and John Bertelmewe from the manor.	Henry IV 1399-1413 Henry V 1413-22
Unknown	Agnes dies leaving a son and heir Sir John.	
Unknown	Sir John dies leaving and daughter and heir Joan who is married to John Danvers of Ipswell and Calthorpe, Oxfordshire.	Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1420/21 & 23 & 45	John serves as a Member of Parliament as Knight of the Shire for Oxfordshire.	
1448	John dies leaving Aston Bruley to his son Thomas.	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83

1502	Thomas dies without issue (with no children) so his brother Sir William (a former Member of Parliament, a Serjeant-at-Law and Justice of the Court of Common Pleas) inherits Aston Bruley.	
1504	Sir William dies leaving a son and heir John.	
1508	John dies leaving an infant son of the same name.	Henry VIII 1509-47
1517	John dies whilst still a minor and Aston Bruley passes to his youngest sister Dorothy who marries Nicholas Hubaud (or Hubold).	
1532	Dorothy settles Aston Bruley on her and her husband with the remainder (estate after her death) to her heirs.	
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England

1610/11	Sir ---- Fitton is the last known lord of Aston Bruley before it is lost from records.
