Pre 1066	Southbury is probably 3 hides (90 acres) of the Abbey of Abingdon's holding in Hanney. The subordinate lord is Ulwi.		
1066	<b>Norman Conquest- Battle of Hastings</b>		
1086	<b>Domesday</b> The Abbey retains its holding in Hanney.		
Post 1100	Hugh de Buckland is in possession of Southbury. He is induced to restore Southbury to the Abbey. The issue is resolved when Osbern, who is a subordinate lord to Hugh, becomes the Abbot's man.		William II 1087-1100 Henry I 1100-35 Stephen 1135-54 Henry II 1154-89 Richard I 1189-99 John 1199-1216
Unknown	Southbury passes to Roger, son of Hemming.		
Unknown	Roger dies leaving a son and heir Thomas.		
1215	<b>Magna Carta</b>		
1215-1217	<b>First Barons War</b>		Henry III 1216-72
1240	Southbury passes to Robert Hemming under the superior lordship of the Abbot. Robert owes a knight's fee of service for the lordship.		
1264-1267	<b>Second Barons War</b>		Edward I 1272-1307
1296	Robert Hemming grants a messuage (farm) and 2/3 of a carucate (80 acres) to Agnes de la Wike.		
Unknown	Robert's lordship passes to Richard Fettiplace.		

# Lordship of Southbury

Date	History of Lordship	Monarchs
Unknown	Richard dies leaving a son and heir John. John takes the manor's name as his own, becoming John Southbury.	Edward II 1307-27 Edward III 1327-77
1382	John grants Southbury to feoffees (trustees) as a transition before conveying it to Alice Perrers (widow of William Wyndsor).	Richard II 1377-1399
1388	Alice is in possession of Southbury.	
Unknown	Southbury passes to Thomas Yonge.	Henry IV 1399-1413 Henry V 1413-22 Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1455-1487	<b>War of the Roses</b>	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83 Edward V 1483 Richard III 1483-5 Henry VII 1485-1509
1486	Thomas dies leaving a son and heir William.	
1487	William dies leaving 4 daughters and co-heirs. The eldest Elizabeth (wife of Thomas Unton) inherits Southbury.	
1533/4	Thomas dies leaving a son and heir Alexander.	
1534	<b>The Act of Supremacy – Church of England</b>	Henry VIII 1509-47
1549	Alexander dies leaving a son and heir Edward.	Edward VI 1547-53
1554	Edward is elected as Member of Parliament for Malmesbury.	Mary I 1553-58
1555	Edward marries the Countess of Warwick.	
1559	Edward is knighted at Queen Elizabeth's coronation.	Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1563	Edward is made a Knight of the Shire for Oxfordshire and serves as a Member of Parliament.	
1567	Sir Edward is appointed High Sheriff of Berkshire.	
1572	Sir Edward is made a Senior Knight of the Shire for Berkshire and serves as a Member of Parliament.	
1582	Southbury is lost from historic records.
