1386	Sir John Thorp (who has been Knight of the Shire and Member of Parliament for Gloucestershire and Wiltshire) dies holding Thorp's manor and it passes to his widow Catherine in dower. He leaves a son and heir Edward.		
1388	Catherine owes service to Richard Scotney. She dies and Thorp's manor passes to Edward. He dies and Thorp's manor passes to his brother Henry and his wife Cicely.

Date	History of Lordship	Monarchs
1400	Henry follows the Earl of Gloucester in a revolt against King Henry. He is unsuccessful and is imprisoned in the Tower of London with his lands confiscated. He pays bail of 500 marks, clears himself and has his lands returned.	Henry IV 1399-1413
1401/2	Henry owes service to Isabel Scotney.	
1411	Henry is elected Knight of the Shire and Member of Parliament for Wiltshire.	
1414	Henry is appointed High Sheriff of Wiltshire.	Henry V 1413-22
1416	Henry dies and Thorp's remains with Cicely.	
1419	Cicely dies leaving a son and heir Ralph, a minor who is put in the custody of the Duchy of Lancaster's Steward in Wiltshire.	
1446	Ralph dies leaving a son and heir John.	Henry VI 1422-61 1470-71
1455-1487	War of the Roses	Edward IV 1461-70 1471-83
1464	John dies leaving a son and heir William.	
1479	William becomes an idiot (mentally impaired)	
1509	William dies leaving a nephew and heir William Clifford.	Edward V 1483 Richard III 1483-5 Henry VII 1485-1509 Henry VIII 1509-47
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England	
1535	William dies leaving Thorp's in dower (for her life) to his widow Elizabeth, his heir being his son Henry.	
1542-54	Henry is appointed a Justice of the Peace in Wiltshire.	Edward VI 1547-53
1547	Henry is elected a Member of Parliament for Salisbury.	
1555 & 59	Henry is elected a Member of Parliament for Great Bedwyn.	Mary I 1553-58 Elizabeth I 1558-1603
1577	Henry dies leaving a son and heir Anthony.	
1580	Anthony dies leaving a son and heir Henry.	
1598	Henry sells Thorp's to John Hatchman.

1618	John sells Thorp's manor to John Poncherdon. It measures 3 yardlands (90 acres).	James I 1603-25
Post 1630	Thorp's passes to William Hearst.	Charles I 1625-49

1705	William dies leaving a son and heir William.	Anne 1702-14
1724	William dies without issue (childless) so Thorp's manor passes to his brother Edward.	George I 1714/27
1750-1850	Industrial Revolution	George II 1727/60
1762	Edward merges Thorp's manor into his manor of Allington and it is not recorded again.	George III 1760-1820 George IV 1820-30 William IV 1830-7 Victoria 1837-1901 Edward VII 1901-10 George V 1910-36 Edward VIII 1936 George VI 1936-52
