1221	Henry de Braibroc (de Braybrook) and his wife Christina Ledet grant one virgate of land in Burton Latimer to the Prior of Bradstoke. Henry is a judge and former High Sheriff of Northamptonshire, Bedfordshire and Rutland.		
Unknown	Nicholas Malemains grants to his sister Hilary land in Burton Latimer on the occasion of her marriage to Sir Walter de Godarville.		
1231/2	Sir Walter is made castellan of Devizes Castle.		
1234	Sir Walter is ordered by King Henry to dispatch horses and arms to assist the Earl of Brittany.

Unknown	Walter dies and Hilary grants the Burton Latimer land to the Prior in frankalmoign (free of alms).	
Prior to 1249	Hilary dies leaving a daughter and heir Joan.	
1250	Joan marries Sir Geoffrey Gacelyn.	
1264-1267	Second Barons War

1502	Nether Burton has come to John Ashby by the right of his wife Letitia. They sell it to Richard Empson.	Henry VII 1485-1509
1504	The Prince of Wales (to be Henry VIII) knights Richard. He is appointed High Steward of Cambridge University and Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster which is in Crown hands.	
1509	Sir Richard is attainted for treason. He was a tax collector under King Henry VII which made him very unpopular. The charge is the crime of "constructive treason" (an undefined category of treason), and is beheaded, Nether Burton is forfeit.	Henry VIII 1509-47
1512	King Henry grants Nether Burton to Sir William Compton, however by Act of Parliament Thomas Empson regains possession of his father's lands including Nether Burton.	
1534	The Act of Supremacy – Church of England	
Unknown	Thomas sells Nether Burton to Richard Fermor, a Merchant of the Staple (wool merchants by Royal charter) at Calais.	
1540	Richard is attainted; found guilty of misprison of treason (not reporting a treasonous act) and sentenced to life imprisonment, Nether Burton is forfeit to the Crown.

1541	Richard is pardoned and Nether Burton is returned to him.	
1551	Richard dies leaving a son and heir John Fermor.	Edward VI 1547-53
1553	John is knighted on the eve of Queen Mary's coronation. He also serves as a Knight of the Shire and Member of Parliament for Northamptonshire.	Mary I 1553-58
1555	Sir John and his wife sell Nether Burton to Richard Humphrey.	
1557	Richard dies and Nether Burton is lost from historic records.
